PINE RIDGE OF GARFIELD VETERANS WALL

On September 5th the Pine Ridge of Garfield management invited post members to attend the unveiling of their Veterans Wall. John Gammicchia has been instrumental in honoring and recognizing our senior veterans for many years. The Post had a great turn out and the C&G News featured a story on this event.

1939 MICHIGAN WAR MEMORIAL

The obelisk that stands at the former Michigan State Fairgrounds is to be disassembled and moved eventually to Milliken State Park on the Detroit River. The post-WWI and pre-WWII memorial bears plaques from VSO's all over the State. It is very poor condition and must be relocated. Thus far \$200,000 has been raised toward the \$600,000 needed to make this happen. VFW Post 6691 has donated \$1000 toward the project and challenges patriotic organizations across the state to match, exceed or at least contribute to this cause. A rally was held on September 16 to bring attention to this need. Post 6691 members Bill Hitzelberger, Mike Sand and Paul Palazzolo were in attendance.

FRASER OPEN HOUSE, FARMERS MARKET AND CITY FAIR

Saturday, October 5, the 31st Fraser Fire Fighter Open House/Farmers Market/City Fair was held at City Hall. The Post and its Auxiliary acquired a booth in order to solicit members, sell "Friends and Families Path of Honor" bricks, and promote the Post. Representatives from the Macomb County SWAT Team, the Selfridge USMC Detachment and Greg Plouff's 1962 Jeep CJ5 were on display on behalf of the post. Special thanks to those who volunteered.

FLAGPOLE DEDICATION
